This vessel is reported to have been struck by heavy seas on the 2nd December last. She took a list & afterwards sank 3 miles off Homborsund. The crew were saved.

A casualty notice was sent to the Owner on the 3rd instant, but no reply has yet come to hand.

SORKYST.—Grimstad, Dec. 2. — Steamer Sorkyst, 71 and from Oslo for Stavanger, with wood, was struck by heavy seas this morning. She took a list and afterwards sank three miles off Homborsund. Crew landed here by a trawler. — "Bergens Tidende."

LOVEN 3.—London, Jan. 27. — With reference to the report relating to the steamer SORKYST, published in issue of Dec. 7, Lloyd's Agent at Oslo writes, under date of Jan. 24: The vessel's name at the time of her sinking off Homborsund on Dec. 2 was really Loven 3, but she had been purchased by new owners who had intended to rename her SORKYST. She is owned by Messrs. B. Tønnesen, Volden, Asker, near Oslo, and had a gross tonnage of 122 tons.
