Dear Sir,

With reference to the classification in the Society's Register Book of your Steamer "SORRISO", I beg to acquaint you that the Committee have to-day had under consideration a communication received from the Society's Surveyors at Marseilles, from which it appears that the Second Special Survey No. 3, which became due on this vessel in March and was partly held at Genoa in May and Trieste in July, has not been further advanced at that port as arranged.

The Surveyors add that they understand the vessel is to be broken up on arrival at Genoa, to which port she is being towed, and in the circumstances I shall be glad to learn for the information of the Committee whether this is your intention. If the vessel is broken up, a record of this fact will be made in the Register Book, which involves the expunging of the class.

At the same time I have to say that if you contemplate employing the Steamer again, all necessary repairs must be effected and the survey of the machinery and boilers completed on her arrival at Genoa, or she will lose her class.
