SOURCE OF INFORMATION.

OVERDUE VESSEL

TIGRIS.—Camber, Oct. 7.—Two lifebuoys marked "Tigris Anvers" washed ashore one mile east of station.

London, Oct. 7.—In reply to inquiry asking for latest news of the steamer Tigris, which left Antwerp on Sept. 18 for Alexandria and passed Dungeness on Sept. 19, the owners have cabled from Antwerp to-day: Tigris passed Folkestone Sept. 19; due Alexandria.

TIGRIS.—Camber, Oct. 7.—Two lifebuoys marked "Tigris Anvers" have been washed ashore one mile east of Jury's Gap Coastguard Station (not as before reported).

London, Oct. 8.—In reply to inquiry asking if steamer Tigris had arrived, Lloyd's Agent at Alexandria cables to-day as follows: Belgian steamer Tigris not arrived. Agents report expected since Oct. 6. No further news.

TIGRIS.—Rye, Oct. 10.—A lifebuoy marked "TIGRIS—Anvers" was picked up near here at 9.30 a.m. on Oct. 4.

Antwerp, Oct. 11.—It is feared that the Belgian steamer Tigris has sunk with the loss of her crew of 33. A body, which is believed to be that of the master's servant, has been washed up on the French coast at Dunkirk, and it is feared that the vessel has been overwhelmed in the recent heavy gales.—Reuter.

TIGRIS.—Antwerp, Oct. 13.—Belgian steamer Tigris, Antwerp for Alexandria, now considered by her owners as having foundered in course of voyage.—Lloyd's Agent.

Antwerp, Oct. 12.—It is reported that part of the cargo of the Belgian steamer Tigris has washed ashore at Boulogne.—"Neptune."

TIGRIS.—Antwerp, Oct. 17.—The owners of the steamer Tigris have received from a correspondent at Wendeny a label, attached to the remains of a bale of tobacco, which had been picked up on the shore. This label corresponds to that of a shipment loaded in No. 3 hold. They have also received a letter from the master of the steamer Willem Rene, in which he states that he navigated in company with the steamer Tigris for 6 hours on Sept. 19. Towards 11 p.m., after passing the Isle of Wight, the master of the Willem Rene lost sight of the Tigris. The weather at that time was very bad. It is, therefore, supposed that the Tigris sank a little beyond the Isle of Wight in the night of Sept. 19-20.—"Neptune."

TIGRIS.—Boulogne, Oct. 19.—In connection with the wreckage coming from the steamer Tigris, a wooden case marked "Sullam-J (in circle) — Alexandria — 1273," containing 48 small tins of varnish bearing the label of the firm "The Anglo-Belgian Varnish Co., Ltd., Hoboken-Anvers," has been brought to Boulogne. Other wreckage has been found on the coast in the vicinity of Audrecelles.

Antwerp, Oct. 18.—Calais fishing vessel 161 has fished up a buoy of the Tigris one mile N.E. of Cap Blanc Nez.—"Neptune."

TIGRIS.—London, Oct. 23.—The owners of the steamer Tigris write from Antwerp, under date of Oct. 20, that according to advices from their agent at Boulogne the following goods have been placed in Customs warehouses:—At Audrecelles: 22 bales leaf tobacco. At Wimereux: 13 bales leaf tobacco. At Boulogne: 1 bale leaf tobacco, 1 case chocolate and 50 one-litre cans siccative. At Portel: 35 one-litre cans siccative. The bales tobacco are marked with various marks: "BTG," "HGM," "AMN."

MISSING VESSEL

TIGRIS.—London, Nov. 5.—Steamer Tigris, of Antwerp, 2737 tons gross, master Berings, which left Antwerp on Sept. 18, 1930, for Alexandria with a general cargo and was last seen off the Isle of Wight night of Sept. 19-20, 1930, was to-day posted at Lloyd's as a missing vessel.
