R. With reference to trawler "DAILY MAIL", which is reported to have gone ashore North West of the Mull of Galloway on the 10th May last, I am directed to say that the Committee will be much obliged if you will kindly favour them with the latest information which you have received as to the extent of damage, prospects of salvage, &c.

The question of making a record of the casualty against the vessel's name in the Register Book will shortly come under the Committee's notice, and it is the practice in cases where it is thought necessary to make such a notation, to expunge at the same time the vessel's class from the Register Book.
