*This trawler left Hull for Iceland on 7th January, and was reported homeward bound on 28th January, but has not since been heard of. The vessel's Register was closed in May. (Board of Trade Return. May. 1925) The owners concur.*

### SOURCE OF INFORMATION.

SCAPA FLOW. — London, Feb. 14.— There is growing uneasiness at Hull as to the safety of the trawler Scapa Flow which is overdue. The vessel left the port over five weeks ago for the Icelandic fishing grounds. She was spoken about a fortnight ago, but since then no tidings of her have been received. Stormy weather has been experienced on the fishing grounds.

SCAPA FLOW.—London, Feb. 19.—Hope has been practically abandoned as to the safety of the Hull trawler Scapa Flow and her crew of 13 hands. She is considerably overdue on her voyage to Icelandic fishing grounds.—“Morning Post.”

SCAPA FLOW.—London, Feb. 23.— The Hull trawler Scapa Flow was to-day given up as lost by the owners. She carried a crew of 13 men, the master being Jacob Marton, of Bridlington. It is feared the trawler has been overwhelmed in the storms at Iceland. H.M.S. Godetia has been dispatched from Lowestoft to search for the Scapa Flow and other missing trawlers.

SCAPA FLOW.—Hull, Mar. 6.— Hull trawler Scapa Flow, which left for Iceland on Jan. 7 and was last reported seen homeward bound on Jan. 28, between Reykjanes, S.W. Iceland, and the Vestmann Isles, Iceland, is missing, and H.M. ships Harebell and Godetia are searching the Atlantic between the Orkneys and Iceland for some trace of the vessel. The unlighted islands off the north coast of Scotland have been searched without result. On Feb. 17, the trawler Barle trawled up a port electric light 12 miles W.S.W. of Myggenaes, Faroe. The lamp is undamaged and does not appear to have been long in the water. It has been examined and found not to belong to the trawler Scapa Flow. It was probably lost overboard when being shipped in place.

SCAPA FLOW.—London, June 12.—In reply to inquiry, Lloyd's Agents at Hull write, under date of June 11, that the owners of the steam trawler Scapa Flow state that no news whatever has been heard of the vessel since she was reported on Jan. 28 last on the S.W. coast of Iceland.
