Précis of particulars of Casualty

This coasting steamer is reported to have left Badagara, Malabar Coast, on 7th February with a cargo of copra &c and to have capsized and sunk on 8th February in 20 fathoms of water.

The vessel's Register has been closed with the notation "Sunk".

No reply has yet been received to the casualty notice sent to the Owners on 27th February.

SOURCE OF INFORMATION

KILINDINI.—Bombay, Feb. 9.—British steamer Kilindini reported sunk between Mangalore and Malepi. Master reached here this morning and reports 17 lives lost.

Bombay, Feb. 9. — The steamer Oostcappelle has brought into Bombay the survivors of a coasting vessel bound from Badagara, on the Malabar coast, to Bombay, with a cargo of copra and ginger, which capsized within a few hours of the start of the voyage. She carried a crew of 28 officers and men and 10 passengers, 16 of whom, including three women and three children, perished.—Reuter.

KILINDINI.—Bombay, Feb. 13.—Steamer Kilindini, master Fakeera, which left Badagara, Malabar Coast, on Feb. 7, loaded with copra, ginger, &c., and 10 passengers, capsized and sank about 1.30 a.m. on Feb. 8 in 20 fathoms of water, between Badagara and Mulki Rock. In the evening the steamer Oostcappelle picked up 21 persons and brought them here; the remaining 16 are believed to have lost their lives.
