We beg to acknowledge receipt of your letter of the 6th instant having reference to the proposal to class the S.S. "NOWSHERA" No. 68837 in the Register Book, with this Society, and with regard thereto beg to state that it would appear this vessel was constructed as a "G" type standard vessel and the hull and machinery are in all respects a duplicate of the S.S. "ROYAL STAR" No. 71723 in the Register Book, Messrs Workman Clark & Co's S.S. No. 438, which was built to class with the Society Belfast First Entry Report No. 8077, the only exception being that the S.S. "NOWSHERA" was not insulated for the carriage of frozen meat.

Under these circumstances it is presumed that the plans of the sister vessel will be sufficient for the purpose of considering the classification of the S.S. "NOWSHERA".
