

S.S. "NOWSHERA".

Mr. Bond, the Marine Superintendent of the British India S.N.Co., again telephoned this Office this morning regarding this case, and stated that the vessel will be in Hull on Monday next, 9th instant, and that the Owners wish the survey for classification to be commenced at once so far as the bunkers are concerned, as it is proposed to put coal on board at that port.

The Belfast Surveyors have already been communicated with in order that plans shewing the scantlings of the vessel and her machinery may be sent to this Office for examination.

In the meantime it is submitted the Hull Surveyors might be informed and requested to commence the survey of the ship for classification in so far as the bunker spaces are concerned, and to take a note of the scantlings and arrangements at that part.

It is noted that the vessel will be dry docked at Falmouth on the 19th instant for <sup>for</sup> classification, and when the scantlings and arrangements have been looked <sup>7.4.23.</sup> into the Falmouth Surveyors will be fully advised regarding the survey.
