With reference to the classification in the Society's Register Book of the Steamer "LORD BROUGHTON", I beg to acquaint you that the Committee have had the case before them to-day, with a letter from The Byron Steamship Co. Ltd., in which it is stated that the vessel has been sold to your company.

The Second Special Survey No. 3 is now considerably overdue, and hitherto the class has been allowed to remain, subject to the completion of this inspection before the end of July next.

In the circumstances, the Committee have deferred action for a month, but as it is concluded that the Steamer has been sold to you for breaking-up purposes, I shall be glad to hear from you directly the work of demolition is commenced.
