the Owner's Representative survey the S.S. "CAIRNTORR" 5387 Tons Gross Register, of Newcastle, with view to ascertaining the nature and extent of damage stated to have been sustained on 27th September, 1928 through fire while the vessel was lying in the Harbour of Leith. For further particulars see Ship's Log Book.

On 1st October, 1928 while lying afloat in the Edinburgh Dock surveyed the vessel, found the damage confined to the Brine Room of the Refrigerating Plant, upon surveying this compartment it was found that some outside sheathing of lining of insulation was burnt, some electric lighting wires also three pressure gauges damaged by heat, and the coating of surfaces in way of deck and at sides of the Brine Room damaged by smoke.

It was recommended that the damaged sheathing wires and three gauges be replaced by new, the wiring to be lead covered and carried through insulation in metal tube, upon completion of repairs the electric lighting of this compartment to be tested. The surfaces of the Brine Room to be cleaned and recoated.
