The Boiler Survey became due in 1,31.

The vessel is laid up and in reply to enquiry the Superintendent states that the main boilers are not used, but that the auxiliary boiler is used for the usual routine work. He desires that the general examination of the auxiliary boiler be allowed to stand over for the present as it is hoped to sell the vessel.

It is submitted the Secretary to the Liverpool Committee be requested to explain to the Superintendent that the required inspection of the auxiliary boiler is not a complete survey but a general examination of the water and sides only.
