
Dear Sir,

Reverting to your memorandum of the 3rd instant relative to the steamer "HOGARTH", I have to acquaint you that the Owners have been informed that as this vessel's boiler survey is now more than twelve months overdue it will be necessary, if steam has been raised in the boilers during the time the vessel has been laid up, for a general examination to be carried out.

The Owners now state that the main boilers have not been, and will not be used before the vessel is commissioned, but that the donkey boiler is used for the usual monthly pumping and routine work. In the circumstances you have been asked to arrange for this boiler to be generally.

For the purpose of this general examination it will be necessary for you to make an internal examination of the boiler on the water and fire sides, but not to carry out a complete Boiler Survey as specified in the Society's Rules, unless the Owners wish this to be done.

I shall be glad if you will be guided accordingly,
