I am favoured with your letter of the 14th instant regarding the steamer "HOGARTH", from which I note that the boilers of this vessel have not been used since the vessel arrived at Dartmouth in September 1930, and that it is not your intention to raise steam in the main boilers for any purpose before the ship is put into commission.

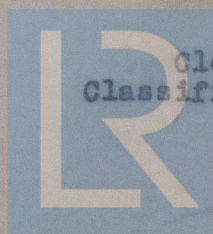
In the circumstances no inspection will be required of the main boilers in the meantime, but as you state that the monkey boiler is used for the usual monthly pumping and routine work, it is concluded that you will have no objection to the Society's Surveyors making a general examination of this boiler, as it is over three years since the boiler was examined by the Society's Surveyors.
