I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 22nd instant respecting the cases of your steamers "WEAP", "VECTIS" and "BROMSGROVE", which were dealt with in my letter to you of the same date.

In view of your further remarks regarding the case of the steamer "VECTIS", your letter has been submitted to the Committee at their meeting to-day, who note that this vessel is still running, and that you are desirous of continuing her in commission as long as possible.

They have again looked into the matter with a view to meeting your wishes as far as possible, and in view of the survey held on the vessel in dry dock in December last and that the Boiler Survey has been completed, I have the pleasure to say that they have now decided to grant you a three months' extension beyond the year of grace, which as you are already aware expires at the end of next month.

The vessel's class will therefore be maintained until the end of July, by which time the Committee trust
