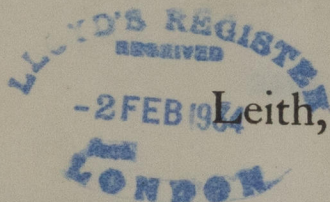

Dear Sir,

In reply to your letter of the 24th instant with reference to the s.s. "STAMOS FAFALIOS", we understand that this vessel is now alongside the breaking up yard of Metal Industries Ltd., but that the work has not yet begun on breaking her up.

We have come to an arrangement with this Firm that they will advise us when work of demolition is begun on any of the vessels which they have bought. This applies to the s.s. "KEATS" your letter of the 7th December last, the s.s. "TORLAK" your letter of the 22nd December last, also your memos of the 10th January, s.s. "HERO", and 31st January s.s. "CLEARPOOL".

You may have noticed in the Press that the s.s. "TORLAK" broke adrift in the North Sea when being towed to Rosyth, and we have no information as to her present position, as she is not in the Forth.
