QUESTION.

I have to refer you to your letter of the 29th July last, in which it was stated that the work of demolition of the above vessel was commenced on the 20th of that month by the Società Italiana Ernesto Breda, of Venice.

Acting upon this information, the case was submitted to the Committee, who decided to make a record of "Broken up" against the vessel's name in the Society's Register Book, and to expunge her class in accordance with the usual practice.

Information has now come to hand from a reliable source, from which it would appear that this vessel has not been broken up, but actually left Venice on the 6th instant bound for Rotterdam under the name of "Ernesto".

In the circumstances, I shall be glad if you will kindly investigate the matter, and let me know by return, the facts of the case.
