The 2nd S.S. No.2 became due 2,35.

On the 21st ultimo the Owners wrote that the ship had been sold to Italian Shipbreakers for demolition and on the 25th ultimo the Rotterdam Surveyors were informed by cablegram that, provided upon general examination they were satisfied, a provisional certificate for the proposed voyage to Italy could be issued.

The Rotterdam Surveyors now report the ship surveyed afloat and a satisfactory general examination carried out.

The starboard bower anchor is reported to have been lost and the spare bower anchor has been fitted.

It is submitted action be deferred, the Genoa Surveyors informed and requested to advise this Office when the work of demolition has been commenced.
