SOURCE OF INFORMATION.

JAN VOLDERS.—Wick Wireless Station.
Mar. 1.—At 1 30 a.m. (G.M.T.) Belmont
trawler Jan Volders thought to be in
distress; position unknown, probably
near Rockall. This station and Malin
Head endeavouring effect communication
with vessel.

Tobermory, Mar. 1.—Belgian trawler Jan Volders, Ostend, 150, Butt of Lewis for Fleetwood, with 400 boxes fish, struck submerged rock north end of Cairns of Coll and remained fast for four hours, afterwards slipping into deep water. No hope of salvage. Crew taken to Tobermory by steamer Langford, of savangers. Taken charge of by Shipping Society agent and forwarded thence destination. No accidents other than No effects. Accident happy.

This brawler is reported to have struck submerged rock at the north end of Cairns of Coll on 1st March. She is stated to have remained fast for four hours, afterwards slipping into deep water - no hope of salvage. The owners concur.
