Sirs,

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 8th instant respecting your s.s. "KENNEDY", in view of your intimation that the vessel has arrived off New York to discharge, the case was reported to the Committee at their meeting to-day.

In view of the circumstances as were set forth in my letter of the 2nd instant, I am directed to inform you that the Committee consider that as you propose, after the discharge of the vessel at New York, to fix her from Cuba with a cargo of sugar for the U.K./Continent, they can only agree to the completion of the Special Survey being postponed until her arrival at this side provided after discharge at New York the Special Survey is advanced as far as opportunity will offer, and the Surveyors can satisfy themselves by a general examination that the vessel is in a satisfactory condition to load the cargo of sugar, as proposed.

It must be understood that any recommendations which the Surveyors make, should be carried out before the vessel leaves New York, and that all the remaining requirements of

the special Survey will be completed on her arrival at this side, say, within the next two months.


