

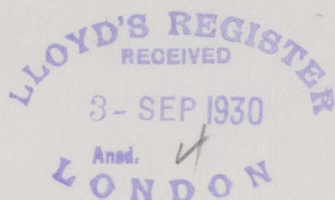

Dear Sir,

I enclose herewith a translation of a letter which we have received from Messrs. Mansei Kisen Kaisha, the Owners of the above vessel in which they state that owing to business depression they have had to lay her up, and that they are unable, in the meantime, to settle our account for Yen 555.00 which has been outstanding since the 21st. of February last.

I have confirmed the statement that the vessel is laid up, and have been advised by another creditor that, although it may mean waiting a year or two, they are likely to settle the account eventually.

Subject to your approval, I propose to

reply that the Committee, in the circumstances, have agreed to a settlement being postponed but in order that the classification may remain undisturbed in the meantime, to request them to furnish a letter, as per copy enclosed, stating that this account will be settled, and all surveys, repairs etc. which may be outstanding will be completed before the vessel again proceeds to sea.
