Representative of the Imperial Munitions Board, survey the
Steamer "WAR SOREL" of Quebec for the purpose of ascertain-
the nature and extent of damage sustained by the vessel on
account of encountering ice while on a passage from Quebec to
Halifax, N.S. 2nd to 21st December, 1918.

On the 28th December 1918, and subsequently the vessel lying
at the Wharf of Messrs Furness Withy & Co. Ltd., Halifax, N.S.

General strakes of planking at between the 7-10 feet marks on
port and starboard bows, heavily scored, treenails and drift-
nails exposed.

Recommended that the vessel be dry-docked and that four (4) lengths
of planking on the port side and three (3) on the starboard side
together with nine (9) graving pieces on each bow be fitted,
securely secured and caulked.

The foregoing repair was effected at this port.
