Précis of particulars of Casualty

This vessel is reported to

have stranded off Karagin'ski
Island, East Coast of Kamchatka,
on the 6th June, and to have refloated
soon after with serious leakage
in forward hold.

Further reports stated that the engine room was full of water & that the vessel was abandoned and subsequently sank in very deep water on the 7th June.

The usual casualty notice was sent to the Owners on the 23rd June, and no reply has been received.

SOURCE OF INFORMATION.

GENZAN MARU.—Yokohama, June 7.
Japanese steamer Genzan Maru was
ashore Kamchatka on June 6, but aft-
wards got off, leaky.

London, June 7.—The following cable has been received from Tokio, dispatched at 12 33 p.m. to-day (June 7): Yamamoto's steamer Genzan Maru reported stranded off Karaginski Island, east coast of Kamchatka Peninsula, last night, and soon refloated with serious leakage forward hold. Further news crew and 300 fishermen left steamer which is sinking.

Tokio, June 7.—Great anxiety is felt for the lives of 300 fishermen and the crew of 40 of the Japanese steamer Genzan Maru, which is aground in a dense fog off the east coast of Kamchatka. Yesterday the vessel's wireless announced that the vessel was being abandoned and that all on board were taking to the boats, but no news has been received from the Genzan Maru since then.
