Messrs Lindsay Burnet & Co., survey during construction two steel manœuvring Air Reservoirs Nos. 5452 intended for the oil engined vessel Messrs Harland & Wolff, Ltd. No. 468. The material has been tested by the Surveyors to this Society, the scantlings are in accordance with the rules for a working pressure of 294 lbs. per square inch and the workmanship is good. The reservoirs were tested in my presence on the 4th October, 1915, by hydraulic pressure to 588 lbs. per square inch, showed no signs of weakness and were found tight and sound at that pressure. The working pressure should not exceed two hundred and ninety four pounds per square inch.


