
H. I have to acquaint you that the Committee recently agreed to the class of the steamer "KENILWORTH CASTLE" being maintained for a voyage, under her own power, from Southampton to Blyth, where she is to be broken up, subject to her being submitted to a satisfactory general examination at Southampton, including the internal examination of such boilers as would be used on the voyage and the adjustment of the safety valves under steam.

A report has now come to hand from the Southampton Surveyors of a satisfactory general examination, and, as it appears from the Shipping Papers that the vessel arrived at Blyth on the 8th instant, I shall be glad if you will keep this case in mind and advise me promptly as soon as the work of demolition is commenced.

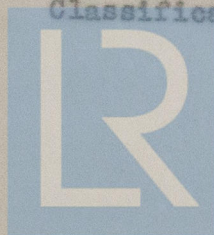
