The 3rd S.S.No.1 became due 1,35 and, after a Modified Survey in January last, it was agreed to maintain the vessel's class for about 18 months from 3,35.

On the expiry of the period of extension, the usual letter of undertaking was furnished by the Owners.

The vessel has been sold to be broken up.

The case is fully stated in endorsement dated 12.12.36 when a proposal to allow the vessel to proceed to Blyth to be broken up was agreed to subject to a General examination being made.

The Southampton Surveyors now report an examination made of the vessel afloat including the steering gear and windlass and found satisfactory.

According to Lloyd's Daily Index the vessel arrived at Blyth on the 8th instant.

It is submitted action be deferred and the Newcastle Surveyors requested to inform this Office when the work of demolition has commenced.
