On 1st December we advised you that the above vessel had been sold by us to the Hughes Bolckow Shipbreaking Co., Ltd., of Blyth, and in this connection, we have undertaken to transfer this ship from Southampton to Blyth/ of the buyers ^{on behalf} early in the New Year.

We understand the freeboard certificate of this vessel expired on 31st May, 1936, and that you were then good enough to grant an extension after a minor Survey. In order that we may take the vessel round to Blyth under its own power we shall be greatly obliged if you will grant us the facility of a further extension of the Freeboard Certificates, and also an extension of the Boiler Survey date.

You will probably wish your Surveyor to have an opportunity of seeing the vessel, its Boiler Mountings and also the safety valves tested. If you are agreeable to our request we shall be pleased to know when your Surveyor would like to make his inspection, in order that arrangements may be made.
