Dear Sir,

We duly received your letter 'F' of 7th instant reminding us that the Freeboard Certificate of the "Kenilworth Castle" will expire on the 31st January.

It will be recalled that in March last year we obtained your approval to a modified Third Special Survey No. 1 being carried out on the "Kenilworth Castle" in view of the approaching withdrawal of the vessel from service, and we were under the impression that this would automatically cover the extension of the Freeboard Certificate until such time as the vessel did in fact cease to run.

It is anticipated that the vessel will make her last voyage from Southampton on the 20th March, returning to that Port on 11th May. Meantime we have been doing and are continuing to do all that is necessary in connection with the modified Third Special Survey No. 1, and we trust to learn that


