August, 1933, for the purpose of ascertaining the nature and extent of the damage alleged sustained through the vessel grounding whilst loading at Sibenik on the 6th. August, 1933.



Witnessed the Diver go down for examination of the vessel under water, and afterwards took a statement from him, as per his report attached hereto, to the effect that the bottom, stern-frame, rudder and propeller appeared to be undamaged.

All hold bilges sounded and, compared with previous soundings, showed no indication of leakage.

Steering gear tested and found to be in order.

RECOMMENDED that the vessel be placed in dry dock for further examination at the first convenient opportunity.
