I beg to acknowledge receipt of your cable reading as follows, and have to explain that the delay in dealing with it was occasioned through my absence on duty at Dubrovnik:-

"TRECİ SALVAGE ASSOCIATION UNDERSTAND SHIPOWNERS CONTENDING TIP PROPELLER BLADE BROKEN BEFORE ARRIVAL VESSEL SIBENIK AND AS DIVER REPORTED PROPELLER UN DAMAGED THEY SUGGEST DIVER FAILED TO MAKE PROPER EXAMINATION UNDERWATER PARTS STOP PLEASE CABLE HERE WHETHER DIVER MENTIONED PROPELLER BLADE OR SUGGEST REASON WHY THIS STATED AS SOUND"

and have to confirm having sent the following cable in reply:-

"TRECİ PROPELLER BLADE NOT MENTIONED BUT CANNOT CONCEIVE HOW DIVER COULD HAVE FAILED OBSERVE SAME IF DAMAGED AS ALLEGED AM ENDEAVOURING INTERVIEW HIM WILL CABLE RESULT"

Today I have ascertained that the Diver is still stationed at Sibenik, and I have arranged with the Naval Authorities to permit him to be interviewed by me tomorrow when I shall cable the result to you.
