

(Sank in the Adriatic, 10th August, 1933).

With reference to your letter of the 17th instant, respecting the loss of the above vessel, and to your enquiry in connexion with the proceedings which are being taken in the Courts here, as to whether the Society's Surveyor at Split, Mr. Brown, would be permitted to come to London to give evidence, I now beg to inform you, in confirmation of the intimation which has already been made to you over the telephone, that I have been in communication with Mr. Brown by cablegram, and he states that it would be possible for him to attend in London, if so desired, as arrangements could be made for his duties to be carried out during his absence.

I would also state that from a letter which has come to hand from Mr. Brown, confirming his cablegram, it appears that he has received a telephone call from Lloyd's Agents at Dubrovnik on the same subject, and as they informed him that the Salvage Association had advised them that this Society had no objection to his attending, he answered them in the affirmative.

As regards the enquiry contained in the last

paragraph of your letter as to what fee would have to be paid in connexion with Mr. Brown's attendance, the matter has been carefully looked into, and I am directed to say that on the assumption that Mr. Brown's presence in London will not exceed six days the fee would not be greater than 150 guineas. If, however, his stay in London should be for a longer or shorter period, the fee would require to be adjusted accordingly.

I take this opportunity to enclose herewith an account for the cost of the cablegrams which have passed between this Office and the Society's Surveyor at Split regarding the above matter.
