Dear Sir,

I am in receipt of your letter of the 18th instant, confirming the cablegrams which have passed between us respecting the enquiry received here from the Salvage Association, as to whether permission would be given you to attend to give evidence in connexion with the proceedings which are being taken in the Courts here regarding the loss of the steamer "TRECII", and I have to inform you that in view of your statement that it would be possible for arrangements to be made for your duties to be carried out by the Society's Surveyor at Susak, in the event of your presence in London being required, the Salvage Association have been advised that the Committee will raise no objection to your attending for the purpose if it should be required.

I am therefore awaiting their further advices in the matter.

I note that you are not clear as to the enquiry in my cablegram regarding the cost for your substitute, and in connexion therewith I may say that it was desired to ascertain what expenses would be incurred in the event of the Surveyor at Susak being required to undertake your duties.
