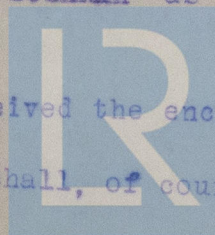
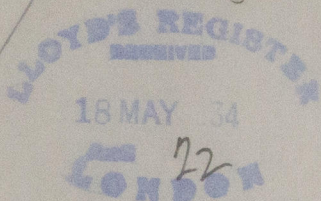

Dear Mr. Scott,

With reference to the case of the steamer "TREČI", I had a visit from Mr. Rusko of the firm of Banaz & Rusko, Lloyd's Agents, Dubrovnik, when he showed me a letter which he had received from the Salvage Association, an extract from which is enclosed. As he informed me that the Owners are taking the matter to Court to try and obtain a settlement, I consider it advisable to refer the question as to the recommendation I made to you, and I shall be glad if you will advise me what reply to make.

In regard to my recommendation that the vessel be placed in dry dock for further examination at the first convenient opportunity, this was made as a matter of form since I had no reason to suspect the sea worthiness of the vessel at that time, as outlined to you in my letter of the 23rd. January last in reply to your confidential letter of the 19th. January. Since writing that letter, I have found that I was misinformed as to the ship which picked up the crew, and I have verified the fact that it was the steamer "BOSANKA" as stated in your letter.

I have today received the enclosed official letter from Banaz & Rusko, but I shall, of course, withhold
