(Then) There is also a further point. The vessel was surveyed by Lloyd's Register Surveyor in consequence of a grounding at Sibenik on 8th. August, 1933. His report recommends that the vessel be continued in her class in the Register Book subject to being placed in drydock for further examination at the first convenient opportunity. The vessel had apparently been surveyed by a diver who reported he could find no damage and the Solicitors would like to have Mr. Brown's statement as to whether he merely recommended the drydocking at the first <sup>convenient</sup> opportunity as a matter of form or whether he had in fact any reason for making that recommendation. Could you approach Mr. Brown and ascertain why he made a qualifying recommendation?
