The 2nd Special Survey No. 3 became due in September, 1933.

A proposal for the vessel to proceed to the Black Sea to load a non-perishable cargo for Italy where she would be broken up was agreed to, subject to a satisfactory general examination being held.

The Piræus Surveyor reported on the 6th February he had generally examined the vessel prior to her proceeding to Genoa at which port she arrived on the 31st March.

In reply to inquiry the Genoa Surveyors now state, in a cablegram dated 2nd May, that the vessel is laid up at their port & breaking up operations have not yet commenced. The Owners' Agents state that she has been resold to Great Britain, but will remain at Genoa, & may be again sold.
