I am directed to inform you that intimation has been received from the Mercantile Marine Department of the Board of Trade that a Formal Investigation has been ordered by the Board to be held into the circumstances attending the loss of the Steamer "RADYR" of Cardiff, Official No. 142,447.


The vessel sailed from Cardiff with a cargo of coal and a crew of 21, bound for Bordeaux, and is believed to have foundered with all hands on the 7th December 1929 off Hartland Point, Bristol Channel.

The Formal Investigation has been fixed for hearing in the Law Courts, Cardiff on the 23rd instant at 2.30 p.m., and I have to request that you will be so good as to arrange to attend this Enquiry.

You should forward for the information of the Committee a report of the proceedings, paying particular attention to all matters concerning the loading, stability, security of hatches, general seaworthiness and structural efficiency of the vessel.
