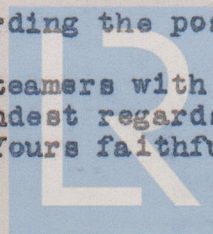
With reference to Hamburg Report No. 14680a of partial classification survey held on the Steamer "T. H. SKOGLAND", you will no doubt remember that it has been arranged to complete the classification of this vessel by the marking and verification of the freeboard when she returns to Hamburg, and in the circumstances I think it well to let you know that according to the Shipping Papers the Steamer left Galveston on the 29th ultimo for Bremen, so that you will no doubt think it advisable to let Mr. Bahr know the facts in the event of opportunity being taken to have the outstanding item attended to at that port.

It is observed that the Steamer "KARI SKOGLAND" purchased by the same Owners is at your port, and that the "HANNA SKOGLAND" (same Ownership) is en voyage for Hamburg from Buenos Ayres, and if you have an opportunity perhaps you would make inquiries regarding the possibility of the classification of these two Steamers with this Society.
