"JAVARY" 4198/2569 tons of London on the 18th June 1920 and subsequently while the vessel was in the Birkenhead drydock and lying afloat in the East Float, Birkenhead, for the purpose of ascertaining the general condition of the hull and equipment.

Vessel examined afloat and in dry dock.

Bottom & rudder cleaned examined and coated.

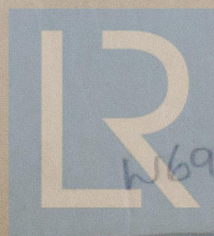
Examined weather decks, hatchways and supports, hatches and beams, masts, rigging, casings ventilators, winches, windlass, steering gear and connections, boats, anchors found 3 bowers, 1 stream and 1 kedge in good order.

In my opinion as far as can be judged from the inspection of the parts which have now been examined, and after reading the Newcastle-on-Tyne report dated 18th Sept/1919, the parts appear to be in fit condition to run for a further period of six months.

No facilities were given for any examination to be made of the holds, bunkers, ballast tanks or peaks.
