Particulars of Casualty

This steamer is reported to have touched rocks off Keelung on 10th December. She was taken in tow but sank about 10 miles N.E. of Keelung the next day in 90 fathoms.

The Kobe Surveyors state they are informed by the Owners that the vessel is a total loss.

SOURCE OF INFORMATION.

TENSHO MARU. — Taipei, Dec. 11. — Japanese steamer Tensho Maru, official number 17337, reported ashore south of Agincourt Island.

TENSHO MARU. — Taipei, Dec. 13. — Japanese steamer Tensho Maru, Keelung for Japan, rice, totally lost at sea. All on board saved.

London, Dec. 13. — A cable from Kobe, Dec. 13, states: — Steamer Tensho Maru sunk in 90 fathoms depth. There is no hope of salvage.

The following cable has been received from Tokio, dated Dec. 13: Hakuyo's steamer Tensho Maru, rice laden, from Keelung, touched rocks near Crag Island, off Keelung, on the night of Dec. 10, and while being towed back with hold No. 2 flooded, sank about ten miles north-east of Keelung on the evening of Dec. 11; depth 90 fathoms and salvage hopeless.

A cable received from the Imperial Marine & Fire Insurance Company, Tokio, states: Steamer Tensho Maru, full cargo rice, total loss.
