SOURCE OF INFORMATION.

PLODDER.—London, Feb. 12.—A message received from the owners of the steamer Plodder states that the Plodder was sunk early this morning through collision with an unknown vessel. The mate and five of the men have been landed by the steamer "Harley" at Shoreham. As far as is known at present, the collision occurred about 20 miles S.E. of Shoreham. The master's boat has not been reported up to the present.
Shoreham, Feb. 12.—Steamer Plodder, of London, Weymouth for Sunderland, light, sunk by collision with an unknown steamer about 20 miles S.E. of Shoreham. One boat, containing mate and five of crew, picked up by steamer "Harley" and landed here; fate of other boat, with master and remainder crew, unknown.
Newhaven, Feb. 12.—Steamer Plodder sunk by collision with steamer ENDYMION, of Glasgow, last night (Feb. 11). Crew saved.
Newhaven, Feb. 12.—Captain Sibbald, of steamer Plodder, with five crew, landed safely by fishing smack "Genny Lena, SM 89."
