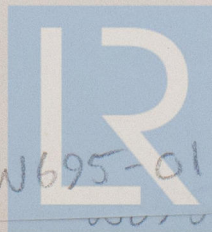
With regard to the numerous communications we have had on the Motor Ship "TROLLTIND", I have to advise you that I recently paid a visit to this vessel without getting any information as to the Owners' intentions. The case of this vessel recently cropped up as a result of an order being placed by Messrs. Pendleton Bros., with the Newport News S.B. & D.D. Co., for a new compressor crank for the port engine.

The Newport News S.B. & D.D. Co., were advised by Pendleton's Representative, not to bother about any test pieces. On hearing of this, I wrote to Messrs. Pendleton Bros., explaining the situation and the enclosed came to hand as a result of my letter. I do not understand from it, whether they intend to retain the vessel's class or not, and they appear to think that they can dispense or otherwise with the class at their own free will.

As you are closely situated to them, perhaps it would be just as well for you to take the matter up with them. Kindly return the enclosed after perusal.
