

Dear Sir,

I have to acquaint you that the Ministry of Shipping state that the ex-German Steamer "ISIS" is being purchased by Messrs. The David Steamship Co. Ltd., and that she is to be drydocked at Liverpool on Monday, the 30th instant, for passing the bottom.

Mr. H. Brewer, the Buyers' Superintendent, has called at this Office and states that it is the intention of his firm to have this vessel classed with this Society should she become their property, and he is desirous that the survey for this purpose should be commenced while she is in drydock at your port.

In the circumstances, I shall be glad if you will kindly arrange for the case to receive attention immediately you are informed by the local representative of the Ministry that the sale of the vessel has been definitely completed, and with this in view the Surveyors should obtain as many scantlings of the Hull and Machinery as possible, so as to avoid future drydocking if practicable. It should be observed that the vessel is nearly new, and the Surveyors might use discretion in the manner in which

Mr. Brewer will be present at the drydocking, and he has been requested to obtain plans if possible and submit them to this Office for consideration.
