The Superintendent also stated that the vessel's equipment had been approved in our London Office subject to the whole of the chain cable being replaced by 300 fathoms of cable at 2 $\frac{7}{16}$ " and one bow anchor being replaced by one of 77 cwt. (stockless) and I would be glad to have this statement confirmed.
