Dear Sir,

We understand there is a coasting steamer of the name of "Galava" arrived at Cork 5th Novr, we don't find her entered in your register nor do we find her in the official register - can you give us any information?.

We do not find the "Octopus" built 1895 or "Walrus" built 1897 by Simens of Renfrew in your register or in the list of dredgers built by that firm. There are two dredgers later built of these names but they are not the boats we refer to. The "Octopus" we refer to has been ^{therein} ~~on the same voyage~~ lost on a voyage from Durban to Geelong and the "Walrus" is due 188 days out and quoted at 75 gs in the overdue list.

The "Octopus" built in 1895 is recorded in the Mercantile
Navy list & appears to be of 969 gross tons, owned by the
Natal Government.

The "Walrus" built in 1897 does not appear to be entered
in the Mercantile Navy list.

It is not the practice to record particulars of
badges in the Register Book unless they are classed by
the Society, or a special application has been made
for their inclusion, and approved by the Secretary.
