SOURCE OF INFORMATION.

MOYALLON.—Fishguard, Sept. 16.—Steamer Moyallon, of Belfast, for Newhaven, sprang a leak last night was taken in tow by steamer Hampshire Coast. At six this morning, when one mile north-west of Strumble Head, tow rope parted and Moyallon sank. Crew ten men landed here by the Hampshire Coast.

—London, Sept. 16.—A telegram from Belfast, dated to-day, states: Messrs. John Kelly, Belfast, received the following telegram this evening from Captain Hutchinson of their steamer Moyallon at Fishguard:—Moyallon lost one mile N.N.W. of Strumble Head at 2.45 this morning. Crew safe; proceeding to Belfast via Liverpool to-night. The vessel had crew of 12 and was bound to Newhaven from Carnegallan, Carnarvonshire, with stones.
