Nature of Survey

The Sunderland Surveyors report this vessel has been placed in dry dock after grounding, bottom and rudder cleaned and coated, rudder lifted and 2 shell plates removed, faired and refitted and 2 plates, 11 frames and 6 floors faired in place, and minor repairs effected. Other repairs have been effected as follows:- lower bridge and forecastle decks and deck over the engineers' accommodation recaulked and a few minor repairs effected.

It is submitted the vessel appears worthy to remain as classed with record of survey.
