PORTGWARRA.—North Foreland Wireless Station, Dec. 31.—Following intercepted:—British steamer Portgwarra bearing from Maas Light-vessel W.N.W. 5 miles, wants assistance, No. 2 hold filling with water.

Amsterdam, Dec. 31.—The British steamer Portgwarra has run aground near the Maas Light-vessel. Four of the crew have been drowned, but the rest have been landed at the Hook of Holland.—Reuter.

Rotterdam, Dec. 31.—British steamer Cromer reports by wireless: British steamer Portgwarra, inward bound, sunk in lat. 51 58 N., long. 3 40 E. It is feared that the crew are lost.

PORTGWARRA.—Rotterdam, Jan. 2.—Nineteen of the crew of the British steamer Portgwarra were saved by a Dutch pilot boat and four were drowned. (See LLOYD'S LIST of Jan. 2.)

London, Jan. 4.—The owners of the steamer Portgwarra advise that steamer foundered at 9 a.m. on Dec. 31, 11 miles W.S.W. of Maas Light-vessel. Survivors crew landed Rotterdam.
