The 1st Special Survey No.3 became due in April, 1915, and was partly held at Hull in May, 1914.

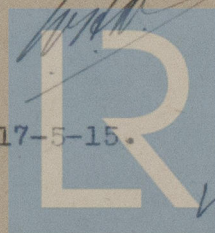
The case received the consideration of the Committee on May 8th, 1914, when a proposal to complete the same within the next twelve months was agreed to.
