With reference to your letter of the 16th instant, enclosing one from Messrs. D. MacIver & Co., respecting the nominal horse power of their Steamers "BARBARY" and "TARTARY", I have now to inform you in regard thereto that on the matter being looked into it is found that the heating surface of the auxiliary boilers in these vessels, which are coupled with the main boilers, has not been taken into account in computing the nominal horse power. It has, however, now been ascertained from the Middlesbrough Surveyors that the heating surface of these auxiliary boilers is 1035 sq. feet, and in view of this the following amended records will be made in the Register Book against each of these vessels, viz:-

H.S. 8235

G.S. 352

N.H.P. 482
