We beg to acknowledge receipt of your letter of the 18th instant, in regard to the new steamer "SUMMERSGILL" which recently foundered at sea when on a passage to Arundel, near Littlehampton, and in reply to state that with regard to the loading, it is stated that the vessels cargo consisted of 228½ tons of coal, and that the same was well trimmed, There was also 35½ tons of bunker coals on board.

With regard to the particulars of the disaster, we have been unable to obtain any particulars further than have appeared in the public prints.
