Surveyed the Steel Screw Cable Vessel "RETRIEVER" 674 tons gross of London, afloat, in the Outer Harbour, Alexandria, on account of touching the bottom near Agami, outside the Port of Alexandria, on the 16th July 1940. Diver's examination carried out and satisfactory, and that I have transmitted to the Committee of Lloyd's Register of Shipping, London, a Report, stating that all repairs recommended by me have been completed to my satisfaction, and that I have Recommended that she be continued as classed, +100.A.I. without fresh record of Survey, subject to the vessel being drydocked at the earliest convenient opportunity for repairs to leaking shell rivets in way of No 1 double bottom tank, being fit to carry for cable services.
